I chair a department that houses two majors and a minor, with roughly 1,200 students in all. The department employs an administrator, 28 full-time faculty, and around 30 adjuncts. As chair, I am responsible for all the administrative tasks of the department. These include course scheduling, managing the department's other-than-personnel budget (roughly \$30,000 per year), managing all aspects of the personnel process, and developing and implementing our strategic plans.
